2022 has been another memorable year. Some events were unexpected and world impacting. Floods, fires, earthquakes, eruptions, and the loss of a monarch who had ruled longer than anyone else previously in history. We as a kura wish to acknowledge and honour Queen Elizabeth the second, aged 96, monarch of 70 years. She was described as a 'constant, compassionate, connector' to, for, and of people, throughout the world. In contrast, she described herself as a servant, with responsibility to God as defender of the faith, and of the people. Charged with such responsibility, Queen Elizabeth devoted herself to sacrificial love throughout her reign, whether long or short, as God determined.

No one could dispute that with integrity, Queen Elizabeth faithfully fulfilled her role, demonstrating unwavering commitment to the well-being of her people. Andrew Lloyd Webber described her as 'a beacon of selfless love' a profound symbol of the power that love radiates. Diplomacy, grace, and humility seasoned her words and engendered trust, won as a result of love and respect. Queen Elizabeth's life exhibited and pointed to the love that Jesus calls us to and which He demonstrated. Such love is not for the fainthearted as it requires a dedication and ability to look to the interests of others ahead of our own, an ongoing challenge which does take courage and commitment. Aroha mai, aroha atu-love received demands love returned.

As it so happens, our 2022 integrated Curriculum theme was 'aroha/love' and this permeated our studies. The brunt of 'covid' and its necessary 'isolation' and or illness meant that we roller-coasted throughout Terms 1 & 2 with attendance reflecting its presence across our community. At the same time, we had unexpected and unprecedented opportunities to tangibly love and serve one another. Aboard our BC Chapman waka, we banded together in faith, hope, and love to, by God's grace, sail smoothly through the various fluctuating weather conditions. In the Scripture passages we learned, we focused on the character of God who IS love, and His demonstration of love, which takes us beyond our own circumstances to engage with other people and our world. We learned to take what He had placed within our hands, and to use it to love, bless, and serve others in practical ways.

The volcanic eruption and subsequent earthquake which impacted the people of Tonga, learning of life in Zambia and the kura Whaea Kirsty has gone to teach at, Antarctica and its global significance, opened our eyes to where, and how others live within their context. Studying the 'Big 5' African animals, their characteristics, habitat, and the dangers they face enabled further consideration of other places, people, creatures, cultures, and challenges. Examining the life and reign of Queen Elizabeth, and the Jubilee celebration opened up knowledge and understanding of history, a 70 year reign, and a life devoted to love, service and sacrifice. Stewarding resources in NZ such as Water, Dairy Farming, and Native Birds reinforced how blessed we are within Aotearoa and what being the kaitiaki/caretakers of creation entails.

Within our kura, Cross Country, Athletics, Speech and Chess Competitions, Choir Concerts, House Football/Ripper Rugby Tournaments, all gave opportunity to develop and showcase the myriad of tamariki talents. Despite the unknowns of when and how Covid might impact our community, our Year 7 & 8 Camp at Finlay Park went ahead in Term 1. It was a huge success alongside our Spring Fair in Term 4, these were other highlights of our 2022 year. The latter gives us the opportunity to work together as an entire BC Chapman whānau to bless our wider Rotorua community. The creating of various items for sale, the collection of ideas for games and activities for children and families who come, gave us a major focus on expressing 'aroha'.

Grit, courage and determination, has been shown throughout 2022, as we paddled through the storms, that were thrown our way. God has truly blessed us and proved HE is the ultimate gracious and faithful sustainer of our BC Chapman waka whānau. Indeed, God's love is constant, pursues us relentlessly, and is poured out through His protection, provision and is woven through His purposes. It has no national boundaries and is available and given lavishly to all people. The Queen herself said:

"Over the years, those who have seemed to me to be the most happy, contented, and fulfilled have always been the people who have lived the most outgoing and unselfish lives." and "It's worth remembering that it is often the small steps, not the giant leaps, that bring about the most lasting change."

Such quotes remind us of the power of love and the impact of a life lived to make a difference through loving God with all our heart, mind, soul and strength and our neighbour as ourselves.


WORLDS HIP HOP DANCE COMPETITION

Condensation drizzles down the window as hot steam from the brewing kettle wafts up into the air. The soft patter of rain on the roof masks the clacking and clunking of mugs and teaspoons. Tiptoeing down the dimly lit hallway, careful not to spill the swirling vortex of chamomile tea, I place the tea into the shaking, wrinkly hands of my grandma, these hands that had once tucked me into bed. I pull a brown leather book from the dusty shelf that lies next to her and begin to read.

"My favorite," she croaks.

Grandma's eyes soften and droop, falling into a deep sleep. For a second, I imagine myself lying cozy in bed falling asleep with wool blankets and hot water bottles. I think back to the times when she was the one who tucked me in at night. The roles are reversed now. I only wish I could turn back time to relive the days when she was taking care of me. My gaze returns to my grandmother, who is old and frail. I know that her time is limited. Age has finally caught up with her. The spine of the book crackles closed as I place it carefully back on the shelf. I sigh. Not with relief but with longingness. Floorboards creak below my feet as I creep back to the kitchen. My eyes, blurred by tears, wander the room as I try to escape the memories flooding my mind. Slowly I begin to feel nudged into remembrance.

The Liquidation of the Ghetto By Samuel Tapper, Y12 This piece is based on the scene of the ghetto burning from the film The Zookeeper's Wife

Magda clutches Maurycy's hand tight. She looks at Antonina's drawn face and listens to Ursula sing the story of the Passover. The familiar words flow over the food, echoing other Seder meals, where each year they heard the old story of the Passover, the story that they grew up with. Ursula's voice takes on a quality beyond the purely natural, reminding them of Seder meals before the Germans came, before the world was torn apart. Her voice reminds them of meals with family before the man on the radio said, "the ghetto has been liquidated."

In the ghetto, rabbis were rocking back and forth praying, calling out to the God of Abraham, Isaac and Jacob, asking how can this be and they're coming. The fire is coming. And the only home that Yosef had ever known now had Germans with guns that shot flames, and he didn't understand and where was his Mama and she was gone.

They've known this story all their lives. Each year, the story of the Passover encourages. It is a tale of courage, a story of deliverance from the oppressors, of God's lovingkindness for his people. Ursula tells of Moses' brave words "Let my people go." She tells of Pharoah's refusal, and then the plagues that fell on Egypt. Finally, the first Seder, with the blood of the lamb painted on the doorframes.


The flames licked the makeshift synagogue. Rabbis clutched their treasures, hidden from the Germans. Menorah, gifts dedicated to Adonai, copies of the Tanakh. But the heat was coming, and the Germans were coming with fire, fire through the gates of hell. Tongues of flame licked buildings and the rabbis cried out for mercy, mercy, God of our Fathers, grant us mercy.

Ursula tells of the firstborn of Egypt. Of how the Egyptians lost all, because of the hardness of Pharoah's heart. But the people of Israel, the people of God, were passed over by the angel of death. Bitter herbs mix with the lamb on Magda's plate, the bitterness of the people of Egypt after they lost all mingling with innocence sacrificed, which was the salvation of Israel.

And the demons drove past the gates of hell in their tanks, watching the ghetto burn. They listened to the prayers of the rabbis fall still, and Yosef's silence told them that their work was done. The only noise was the cracks and splinters of burning buildings, as they eliminated all trace of those who once were caged in the ghetto.

Ryzs hears for the first time, of how the people of Egypt gave up their gold and silver to Israel. His thoughts turn on their own, and he wonders. He wonders how can this happen in his world? But while Ursula finally tells of the triumphant crossing of the Red Sea, the final escape from slavery for Israel, a little spark of hope rises in his heart. God's people will never be forsaken.

And the Germans took treasures which were not their own from that which was once someone. A wedding ring, a pair of glasses, a watch. And the cattle cars pulled away from the station, on their long journey to Auschwitz Birkenau, while the world burned. And with Antonina, still there is a remnant, passed over by those who would see them destroyed.







MATERIALS TECHNOLOGY




Our workshop continues to be a safe environment for students to discover new construction techniques, test their concepts, learn from their mistakes, and ultimately complete projects they can be proud of. Students are encouraged to receive feedback from stakeholders throughout their design processes. It is pleasing to see students grasp the benefit of this, and give due consideration to the people who will use their projects.

This prepares students for the real world, where they will need to design and construct for clients. The culmination of this philosophy is the Year 13 Service project, in which students design for an individual or community group of their choice.









In the Geography Department, we study how people interact with the world around them. This is best done on field trips in diverse locations like Tongariro National Park, Waihi gold mine and the Luge at Rotorua. 2022 has brought with it many challenges, not least of which have been examples of increasingly extreme weather events in NZ and overseas, As we study these weather events, we can see many environmental issues and challenges that have arisen from people's behaviour and their relationship with the environment. In Genesis 1, we see God's first command is to manage (steward) creation, bringing out its potential for the benefit of all people (see Genesis 1:28, 2:15). This reminds each one of us that our world is changing rapidly, and in Geography, we look at how each one of us can equip ourselves to meet the challenges that lie ahead.




















At Bethlehem College an integral part of our learning environment is service. This year we have again been unable to travel off shore for any mission service trips due to restrictions. Plans are being developed to restart these opportunities that are so beneficial for our students understanding of other cultures and engaging in service projects.

However, we have been able to continue our focus on needs outside of our community through participation in events such as the World Vision 40 Hour Famine, the Cancer Society Daffodil Day, and contributing to the needs of the Tauranga Foodbank by donating a large quantity of non-perishable goods.

Around 35 of our senior students spent 4 days in the Hawkes Bay serving in a low decile school and the community surrounding it. We have committed for developing this into a long-term relationship meeting needs as we are able. Students have also been encouraged to register the Student Volunteer Army (SVA) programme which recognises the hours many students are contributing to the community through organisations such as Riding for the Disabled or their churches. Students receive badges relating to hours served and a record of service to accompany their CV.
